

How to Make Notes For Your E-Mag Articles

Once you have your Guiding Questions approved, you need to start looking for information to answer your questions. You **must** use the following guidelines when you make your notes for this assignment!

1. At the top of the next clean page in your social studies notebook (or in a Google Doc), write your first guiding question.
2. At the top of the next clean page in your social studies notebook (or under the first question you wrote in a Google Doc), write your second guiding question.
3. Continue the above until you have written all of your guiding questions **on the top of different pages (or under each other in a Google Doc)**.
4. Start looking for the answers to your question. **DO NOT USE WIKIPEDIA AS A SOURCE OF INFORMATION!!!** Rather, I suggest you start looking for information in the Elm4You data bases linked in my blog. When you find an answer, write it on the appropriate page based on the guiding question it answers.
 - a. Make sure your notes are in your own words, **and it may be a good idea to bookmark the web site/database you are using if online.**
 - b. If you are using a book, write down the title and page number.
 - c. If you cannot find any answers, try working on another one of your guiding questions.
5. Whenever you locate information, **remember to cite your source using EasyBib! The best way to get to your EasyBib account is to use the link on my blog on the Electronic Magazine Project tab located at the top of my blog.**
6. Let me know if you are having any troubles! You need to make a thorough set of notes so you can write a strong, detailed rough draft. **You will need to work on this assignment at home, and I highly suggest that you locate some books to use for this assignment.**
7. **AS A REMINDER, DO NOT USE WIKIPEDIA AS A SOURCE FOR INFORMATION!**
